

[Vienna] Top Five Places

BRUNNENMARKT

Head for breakfast or brunch in Vienna's colourful, newly fashionable district of Ottakring. Adding a little Southern European flair in the heart of Central Europe, the Brunnengarten has a strong Turkish flavour. Numerous young artists have set up shop in the surrounding area, making the market and nearby Yppenmarkt among the most electric neighbourhoods in the city.

OPEN-AIR EVENTS

From January to March each year, the fabulously illuminated façade of Vienna's Rathaus (City Hall) is the backdrop for a 600-metre-long skating rink, curling lanes and a large heated marquee filled with Austrian goodies. In summer, the park is transformed into an open-air cinema and stage. In summer you can also enjoy an urban beach holiday by the Danube Canal.

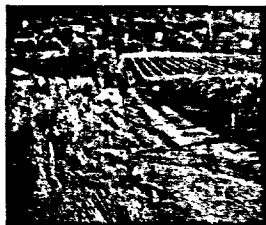

HIKING

Staying more or less within the city limits, you can hike through the Vienna Woods, up the surrounding hills and along the Wine Trail. The hiking is not too strenuous, and you can always take a bus to the top and slowly make your way back to the city centre. Sipping outstanding wines and enjoying the breathtaking views are what it's all about. The 10-km trail through the vineyards is dotted with scenic outlooks over the city and the Danube.

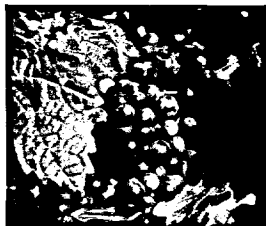

HEURIGER WINE TAVERNS

While hiking through the vineyards surrounding Vienna, stop in at the Grinzing Heuriger and have a glass of wine from the current Viennese vintage, along with a fitting culinary accompaniment. Heuriger wine taverns combine the conviviality of the city with the rural ambiance of the vineyards. They are as much a Viennese landmark as the Prater Ferris Wheel, Schönbrunn Palace, Vienna Boys Choir and Lipizzaner Stallions.
