

The following petitions were severally read and received:—

Of Central Finance Corporation; praying for the passing of an Act amending its Act of incorporation and enlarging its powers.

Of The Premier Guarantee and Accident Insurance Company of Canada; praying for the passing of an Act extending the time during which it may obtain a license to carry on business.

Of Canadian Medical Association; praying for the passing of an Act incorporating certain of its members and others under the name of "The Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons of Canada."

Of British Colonial Fire Insurance Company; praying for the passing of an Act changing its name to "British Colonial Assurance Company," and for other purposes.

Of The Dominion Fire Insurance Company; praying for the passing of an Act declaring the par value of its ordinary shares, and for other purposes.

Of Cobb Connector Company, of Los Angeles, in the State of California, one of the United States of America; praying for the passing of an Act authorizing the Commissioner of Patents to make an order restoring and reviving patent No. 157,331 for new and useful improvements in couplers for train pipes.

Of Canadian Pacific Railway Company; praying for the passing of an Act authorizing it to construct a line of railway from a point on its existing line at or near Lanigan, thence in a generally northerly direction to a point at or near Humboldt, thence in a generally northwesterly direction to a point at or near Prince Albert, all in the Province of Saskatchewan.

Of Jean Baptiste Hurteau, of Terrebonne, Quebec, manufacturer; praying for the passing of an Act authorizing the Commissioner of Patents to make an order restoring and reviving patent No. 190,547 for improvement of boots and shoes.

The Honourable the Acting Chairman, from the Standing Committee on Divorce, presented their forty-ninth Report.
