

*Business of the House*

(Text):

Was there any protest from the province of Quebec against the help given by the federal government for educational purposes, namely educational assistance for technical schools and vocational training?

**Mr. Fleming (Eglinton):** None that I am aware of, Mr. Chairman. As I have indicated, the province of Quebec has participated in this scheme now for many years.

**Mr. Caron:** Therefore when it comes to training of the labouring class there is no protest, but when it comes to higher education there is a protest. Is that what I am to understand from what the minister says?

**Mr. Martel:** There is a difference between technical schools and education.

**Mr. Caron:** Just as much as there is between an intelligent man and the hon. member.

**Mr. Denis:** Can the minister give any serious reason why he should not allow this item to stand and go on with some other item?

**Mr. Fleming (Eglinton):** Yes, I have a very good reason. It is ten o'clock.

Resolutions adopted in committee of supply this day reported and concurred in.

**BUSINESS OF THE HOUSE**

**Mr. Chevrier:** May I ask the leader of the house what the business is for tomorrow, and perhaps we might get some indication of what it will be for the early part of next week?

**Mr. Green:** Mr. Speaker, tomorrow we intend to move concurrence in the Senate

amendments to Bill No. C-26, to amend the Northwest Territories Act, which appears as the first item on today's order paper. Then we shall continue with the supplementary estimates.

It is always somewhat of a problem to hold the members of the other place here beyond certain days. I think we shall have royal assent tomorrow at 5.45, and we would hope it will be possible to have these supplementary estimates through and the bill passed here and in the other place and assented to. Then we will take agricultural estimates.

Monday will be private members' day. On Tuesday we shall start with item No. 7, the resolution concerning parliamentary secretaries, and then take item No. 8, the resolution concerning freight rates. Incidentally, I think that bill will be sent to the standing committee on railways, canals and telegraph lines. Then we will take item No. 3, the bill to amend the Canada Shipping Act, which will also go to the same standing committee, and then item No. 9, the resolution concerning the Federal-Provincial Tax-Sharing Arrangements Act.

**Mr. Denis:** In order that the minister may be satisfied may I suggest that the Minister of Finance get the answers to the questions we asked just before 10 o'clock.

**Mr. Chevrier:** May I ask the minister if on Wednesday we will go on with any of the unfinished business announced for Tuesday?

**Mr. Green:** Yes, Mr. Speaker.
