INTERIM SUPPLY

Hon. Donald J. Johnston (President of the Treasury Board) moved:

That the House concur in Interim Supply as follows:

That a sum not exceeding \$8,267,119,391.59 being the aggregate of:

- (a) three-twelfths of the total amounts of the items set forth in the Estimates for the fiscal year ending March 31, 1982, \$7,227,421,694.50;
- (b) an additional eight-twelfths of the total amount of Indian Affairs and Northern Development Votes L45 and L50 and Public Works Vote 45 (Schedule A) of the said Estimates, \$12,956,000;
- (c) an additional seven-twelfths of the total amount of Transport Vote 35 (Schedule B) of the said Estimates, \$2,216,666.67;
- (d) an additional six-twelfths of the total amount of Industry, Trade and Commerce Vote 20 and Treasury Board Vote 10 (Schedule C) of the said Estimates, \$60,275,000;
- (e) an additional five-twelfths of the total amount of Communications Vote 50 (Schedule D) of the said Estimates, \$1,729,166.67;
- (f) an additional four-twelfths of the total amount of Treasury Board Vote 5 (Schedule E) of the said Estimates, \$73,333,333.33;
- (g) an additional three-twelfths of the total amount of Indian Affairs and Northern Development Votes 35 and 40, Industry, Trade and Commerce Vote L30 and Secretary of State Vote 30 (Schedule F) of the said Estimates, \$93,975,000;
- (h) an additional two-twelfths of the total amount of Consumer and Corporate Affairs Vote 5, Employment and Immigration Vote 25, Energy, Mines and Resources Votes 1 and 20, Indian Affairs and Northern Development Votes 15 and 55, Labour Vote 15, Public Works Vote 40 and Transport Vote 20 (Schedule G) of the said Estimates, \$610,248,066.67;

(i) an additional one-twelfth of the total amount of Communications Votes 20 and 80, Energy, Mines and Resources Vote 15, External Affairs Vote 35, Fisheries and Oceans Vote 10, Governor General Vote 1, Indian Affairs and Northern Development Vote L60, Industry Trade and Commerce Vote 10, Labour Vote 5, Secretary of State Vote 1, Supply and Services Votes 1 and 10 and Transport Votes 50, 85 and L100 (Schedule H) of the said Estimates, \$184,964,463.75;

ESTIMATES FOR FINANCIAL YEAR ENDING MARCH 31, 1982

Hon. Donald J. Johnston (President of the Treasury Board) moved that Bill C-63, for granting to Her Majesty certain sums of money for the Government of Canada for the financial year ending March 31, 1982, be read the first time and printed.

Motion agreed to.

Mr. Johnston thereupon moved that Bill C-63, for granting to Her Majesty certain sums of money for the Government of Canada for the financial year ending March 31, 1982, be now read the second time and be referred to Committee of the Whole.

Motion agreed to, bill read the second time and the House went into committee thereon, Mr. Francis in the chair.

The Chairman: Shall Clause 2 carry?

On clause 2—

Mr. Knowles: Mr. Chairman, can the President of the Treasury Board (Mr. Johnston) assure us there is nothing in this bill that ought not to be in it?

Mr. Johnston: Mr. Chairman, the form of this bill is the same as that passed in previous years. The proportions requested in this bill are intended to provide for all necessary requirements of the Government of Canada up to June 20, 1981.

In no instance is the total amount of an item being released by the bill and the form of the bill is the usual one for interim supply bills.

The passing of this bill will not in any way prejudice the rights and privileges of members to criticize any item in the estimates when they come up for consideration in committee. The usual undertaking is hereby given that such rights and privileges will be respected and will not be curtailed or restricted in any way as a result of the passing of this bill.
