“ Wherefore lest your Majesty’s present Gover-
 “ nor should not in due time advert to this part
 “ of his duty, and lest a constitution, calculated
 “ to promote the welfare and happiness of your
 “ Majesty’s subjects there, and adapted to the pe-
 “ culiar circumstances of that province, should be
 “ mistaken or withheld; we are humbly of opi-
 “ nion, that it should be given in instruction to
 “ the Governor, forthwith to comply with your
 “ Majesty’s royal will and pleasure, signified in the
 “ 7th article of your Majesty’s instructions above
 “ recited, by communicating to the Council, such
 “ and so many of your Majesty’s instructions,
 “ wherein their advice and consent are made re-
 “ quisite, with such others, from time to time, as
 “ as he should judge for your Majesty’s service to
 “ be imparted.

“ We come now to consider the motion made
 “ by the Chief-Justice on the 23d day of April,
 “ being the meeting of Council immediately an-
 “ tecedent to their prorogation; and this motion
 “ stands on the Journal in the following words,
 “ viz.

“ That, whereas by an act of parliament for
 “ the making more effectual provision for the go-
