- (a.) The resulting total will determine the candidate's place in the competitive list, the successful candidates being those who stand first on the list up to the number of vacancies competed for, if otherwise qualified.
- 77. A list of the successful candidates, together with the total number of marks gained by each, will be published in the Canada Gazette.
