CANADA THUS GETS REDUCED RATES

Ten Cents a Word for Commercial Cablesgrams and Five Cents for Press Messages. Ottawa, March 10.—Signor William Marconi, the inventor of wireless telegraphy, is in Ottawa again. He arrived to-night, and to-morrow will call upon the Finance Minister and other members of the government to conclude arrangements for the erection of a station in Cape Breton, towards which the government is to contribute \$80,000.
