Some contend that rate payers having property in more wards han one can only vote once, as they do for mayor, while others contend that ward if the voter is entitled to vote in the ward. The Clerk of York Township takes the view that local option cannot be voted upon like a money by-law. Others contend that the principle is the same, and that it can be voted on as any other bylaw, and point to the fact that the revenue received from hotels is a question of finance in man-aging the town's affairs, and the prin-ciple of a money bylaw is that, where the Council proposes to make any un-usual expenditure or forego any expenusual expenditure or forego any expenditure, an expression of opinion must be taken from the people. It is contended that if ratepayers cannot vote in each ward, there is nothing in the act to prevent it, and if a voter does vote in every ward there is no penalty clause. The oath may be administered, but the oath specifically states that the voter must not have previously voted in that ward. Some ratepayers have property in three polling sub-divisions in one ward; but they can only vote once in that ward. J. W. St. John, M.L.A., has given a written opinion covering several pages, and quoting many authorities, to show that ratepayers can vote where legally qualified to vote on any bylaw; that is, vote in The W. & D. 




