

May 5, saying: "A message from Saskatchewan Landing, via Swift Current, per cour-ier, who arrived this evening, from Battleford, brings news of another battle fought with Indians on Chief Poundmaker's reserve at Cut Knife Hill, on Sunday, May 3. "A flying column of 300 men under Col. Otter attacked the Indians, who were 600 strong, at 5 o'clock in the morning. The fight lasted till noon. Our loss was 7 killed and 12 wounded. "Colonel Otter covered, including the engagement, 70 miles, fought the battle and returned inside of 30 hours. The men behaved magnificently. "The list of casualties is as follows: Killed-Northwest Mounted Police-Corporal Lawrie, Corporal Sleight, Bugler Burke; Ottawa Sharpshooters (G.G.B.G.), Private Osgoode, Private Rogers; "C" Co. Infantry School, Tor-onto, Private Dobbs or Dawe of Co-bourg. Wounded-Northwest Mounted Police, Sergeant McLeod; "B" Battery, Lieut. Pelletier, Lieut. Gaffney, Cor-poral Morton, Gunner Reynolds; "C" Co. Infantry, Sergeant Major Spackman, formerly of the Coldstream Guards, and latterly of Toronto; Ottawa Sharp-shooters (G.G.F.G.), Color Sergeant Winter, Private McQuilkey; Queen's Own Rifles, Color Sergeant Cooper, wounded in the thigh; Private Watts, a member of B company, Private Nary; Battleford Volunteers, Private Gilbert." 


