JUMP RECORDED IN WHEAT PRICES

Big Shortage in Yield Indicated by U.S. Government Report.

MARKET AGITATED

Lack of Sales to Europe Noted Despite Trade Activity.

CHICAGO, June 9 .- Wheat jumped up

in price today, chiefly as a consequence of the government crop report indicating that the yield in the U. S. this season would fall short of the 1915 total by almost 300,000,000 bushels. Corn lost a shade to ½c. oats gained ½ to ¾c and provisions finished irregular, ranging from 7c decline to a rise of 20c.

Free buying lifted the wheat market in a hurry right at the outset. Profit taking was active on the bulge, but caused only a moderate reaction. Then prices again started upward, influenced by opinions expressed that 90 per cent. as the June condition of the spring crop rendered a good harvest of spring wheat, a most unlikely outcome. In this connection the fact was pointed out that, with four exceptions, the percentage named was the lowest in fifty years. Under such circumstances bulls remained in easy control of the market bhruout the session, altho the top prices of the day were not upheld during the last half hour of trading.

Bearish news regarding wheat consisted principally of favorable crop reports from the southwest, including assertions of notable improvement in Kansas. Oklahoma sent w ord that shipments of new grain were expected early next week. On the other hand, ho sales whatever to Europe were reported, except 110,000 bushels at St. Louis to go out by way of the Gulf of Mexico.

Bearish conditions depressed corn in the final transactions. Previously the market had sympathized with the strength of wheat and had been influenced by adverse crop reports from Iowa and Missouri. Pork rose on account of the scantiness of offerings and because of a good demand from grain houses. Lard and ribs were subjected to much selling pressure that was credited in the main to a leading packer.
