CORN PRICES TAKE DROP AT CHICAGO

Sympathy With Weakness of New York Market is Shown.

Chicago, Nov. 1.—Corn prices averaged lower today on account of sympathy with weakness in the New York stock market. The close was unsettled at 117 1/4 for December, and 113 1/4 for May, 5-80 down to 1-40 compared with 24 hours previous. Receipts, 1-10 to 2-00 to 3-00. Provisions again set a net advance of 10c to 14 points.

Also wheat etrade depression formed the chief bearish element in the corn market, weather conditions likely to promote the movement of new grain tended also to pull down values.
