Mayor Church Secures Data on Results Gained in Buffalo.

**BLAMES LEGISLATION** 

Bill Thrown Out Would Have Achieved End, Says Mayor.

Mayor Church has been gathering information concerning the effect of rent profiteering legislation adopted by New York State a year ago, and as a result of his investigation he is con-vinced that a law such as he proposed last February, authorizing a rent court nere, would solve the problem in

The mayor made the following statement Saturday:

"My bill with regard to a rent cours which passed the city council last February, but did not pass the legis-lature last April, would have filled the bill entirely, notwithstanding what attorney-general's department, and would have got immediate and speedy results.

Give Free Hand.

"Any regulation snould not name a percentage, but whatever court is es-tablished should have a free hand to tablished should have a free hand to consider the cases and give a decision on the merits of the particular case before them, as each case is different. "The rent court in Buffalo has been operating since April. 1920, under the new landlord and tenant act, passed by the New York legislature, by which county court indees are authorized to

county court judges are authorized fix rents, and are given power to s the execution of warrants for eviction of tenants who have been to secure new quarters. They are also dealing with drastic regulations with regard to apartment houses." 
