Torbay is celebrated as the place where the English landed to recapture St. John's from the French in 1762. Population 1,450.

TRAP COVE, a fishing settlement on the Labrador; population 58.

TREPASSEY (Trepassey Bay), a post, money order, telegraph, preventive station, fishing and farming settlement in Placentia and St. Mary's district; nearest port of entry and railway station, St. John's, 81 miles by land; coastal mail steamer calls here fortnightly from St. John's, 75 miles, fares \$3.00 and \$1.00; contains 5 stores, 1 church, 1 convent; good harbor, safe entrance; population 700.

TRINITY, proper, the chief town of Trinity district (including S. W. Arm, N. W. Arm and N. E. Arm of Trinity), a post, money order, telegraph, port of entry, fishing, farming, lumbering and shipbuilding town in District of Trinity; nearest railway station Clarendville, 25 miles by water; banks and express office St. John's, 68 miles; coastal mail steamer with mails from St. John's fortnightly during summer, fares \$3.50 and \$1.50, winter mails semi-weekly by rail and courier; contains two large merchantile establishments besides 11 stores, 2 hotels, court house and goal, 2 halls. A newspaper the "Trinity Record" issued weekly, \$1.00 per year, J. A. Barrett, editor. A lighthouse at the entrance. The scenery is magnificent in and around Trinity; there are 3 churches and schools; population 1,400.

TROUT RIVER, a way office and fishing settlement in St. Barbe district; all connections at or the same as Bonne Bay, Woody Point; connected by courier; fare 50 cents; nearest railway station Bay of Islands, 12 miles; contains 2 stores and 1 church; population 200.

TROUTY, a post, fishing settlement in District of Trinity; all connections at or the same as Trinity, 5 miles; contains 1 store, 1 church and school; population 250.

TROYTOWN (or Triton), on Triton Island, Notre Dame Bay; a post fishing and lumbering settlement in Twillingate district; nearest money order office and coastal mail steamer Pelley's Island 6 miles; telegraph and port of entry Little Bay, 15 miles; railway station Norris Arm, 40 miles; connected by bay steamer; contains 2 stores and 1 church; population 200.
