



MEMORANDUM

Mr. Pedley, -

We cannot allow the Kamloops Industrial School to remain in the unsanitary condition in which it now is, ~~and~~ with the expenditure of \$1665.00 we can so improve the sewage and water system that the building will be habitable. I think we should also instal the electric light at a cost of \$400.00. We will be able to spare this amount from the General Vote, as the work is urgently necessary. It would, of course, be well to erect new buildings at this point and we have had this in view for sometime, but it has been understood that in improving the Industrial School buildings in British Columbia, the Kuper Island School should be rebuilt after we finish the Kootenay School, ~~and~~ after the Kuper Island School the Kamloops building should be attended to.

As it will likely be sometime before we can obtain an appropriation to build a new building at Kamloops, I would recommend that the water and sewage system be improved and the electric light be supplied.

It is understood from Inspector Green's report that most of the work can be done by the Trade Instructor and the Principal if the Department will provide material.
