TWO VILLAGES ARE WIPED OUT

Forest Fires do Great Damage on the Quebec Border—Fires in Other Places.

Campbellton, N. B., Aug. 20.—Forest fires are doing considerable damage in this vicinity and the air is thick with smoke.

It was reported yesterday that the village of Caplan, in the county of Bonaventure, about 70 miles from Campbellton, with another settlement just back of it, had been almost wiped out of existence.

Very meagre particulars are to hand but it is said that about seventy buildings have been destroyed and a large number of people are homeless.

Another fire is raging near Beaulieu, so far as can be learned it has not reached the settlement, though the damage to the lumber lands is considerable.

Still another fire is burning and spreading rapidly just back of Campbellton, near the Sugar Loaf Mountains.

Unless there is a heavy fall of rain through the night a large amount of timber will be laid in ashes.

The thermometer registered 96 in the shade here today.

MONCTON, Aug. 20.—Forest fires raged in the vicinity of Sunny Brae this afternoon yesterday. No buildings were destroyed, though considerable damage was done to crops, fences and timber lands.

FREDERICTON, Aug. 20.—Word has been received here that valuable timber lands on the Miramichi and in the vicinity of the Blooded Ridge are on fire.

It was also stated that there were forest fires raging along the St. John river between Caplan and Caplanville.
