FINANCES.

The total income of the Society for the year amounts to \$35.709.86, which is the fifth highest of all previous years, and under the circumstances is larger than anticipated; because, in addition to the stringency of the money market, the severe winter, with its unusually heavy storms and snow drifts, which blocked the roads in many parts of the country, prevented the ladies from making their collections for the Society at the usual time, consequently, in some districts, the canvass was neglected altogether, while in other cases the returns were not made in time to be included in the year's revenue, which is somewhat less than the previous year.

QUEBEC AUXILIARY BIBLE SOCIETY.
