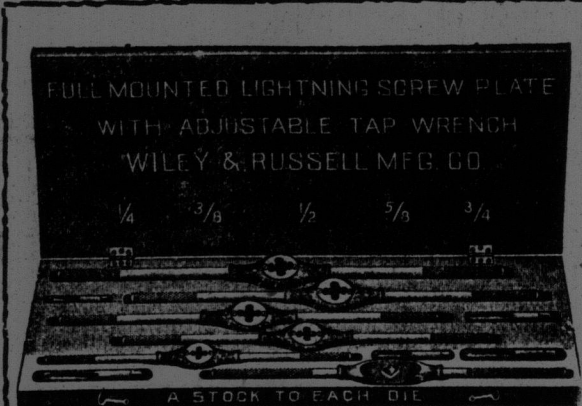

ITALY'S STAND ALARMS BERLIN

Intervention in War on Side of Allies Becomes Imminent

NEUTRALISTS HAVE FAILED

Meetings in Rome Financed by Kaiser Always End in Rioting—Whole Nation United

Rome, Feb. 27.—With the object of averting a crisis which is invariably provoked by neutralists, whose efforts to prevent intervention are useless since the entire population favors war, the government will probably prohibit meetings and demonstrations.

This decision will correct the mistaken position abroad that Italians are disunited. The neutralists are financed by Germany.

The Italian press expresses indignation at an inspired statement in the Fremdenblatt, of Vienna, to the effect that the Italian government and people are opposed to war, and that the negotiations of belligerents have failed, hence the government is avoiding debate in parliament.

The Giornale d'Italia comments unfavorably on the statement, and disavows its official character, and says that the people and the government are united and ready and determined on intervention. When they strike the Austrian lions will be dispelled.

The German reply to Italy's observations in the blockade of the British coast has arrived. Its tone is more courteous than that of the notes to the other neutrals. It declares that in view of the relations between the two countries Germany will respect the Italian flag.

Close observers in Rome of the political situation declare that since the readiness of Italy to join in the war has become apparent, the insistence of Germany upon her continued neutrality has grown stronger.

It is declared in a reliable quarter that Prince von Buelow, the German Ambassador to Italy, has announced the Italian situation to his government substantially as follows:

"I have spent nearly 2,000,000,000 lire (\$300,000,000) in war preparations since the outbreak of hostilities, consequently, action on her part is daily becoming more imperative. Furthermore, for internal reasons, all political parties are asking the government to obtain as a result of diplomatic negotiations or through the use of the Italian army and navy, the fulfillment of the aspirations of the nation, particularly in return for the heavy sacrifices already made."

Germany urged Austria-Hungary strongly to cede to Italy her Italian province of Trent and a portion of the Isonzo peninsula, with the idea of keeping Italy neutral at the present time, and enlisting her favor for the future.

It has been asserted in Rome that Prince von Buelow has said Austria must be induced to accede to his views concerning territorial concessions to Italy, else he would resign his post.

Concern in Wilhelmstrasse.

Berlin, Feb. 27.—A sudden change of feeling concerning the attitude of Italy has been noticeable in diplomatic quarters here during the last few days. The position of Italy appears to have become a matter of much greater concern.

The reasons for this change are not clear at this time.

The foregoing despatch from Berlin is inspired by the German government. It is the first time there has been any mention in Berlin of the news of fiction between Germany and Italy.

"WAR" BABIES HEALTHIER

Paris, Feb. 27.—Professor Pinard, of the Academy of Medicine, contributes an article to the Matin showing that "war children" are stronger and healthier than their predecessors and that France is rapidly repairing her battle losses.

An analysis of the Paris statistics for the last six months reveals diminution of the death rate among mothers and children and a decrease in the number of the children born dead.

Dr. Pinard further asserts that an extensive comparison of living children with those born earlier shows that the average weight of "war babies" is considerably higher than it used to be. This he considers due to the giving of natural instead of artificial nourishment by the mother, in consequence of the more serene attitude they take to their duty to the state.

This says the professor is one more instance of the spirit of regeneration animating France.
