EXPECT 100 AT WOMEN'S MEETING

Programme of Annual Session of N. B. Institute in Fredericton Next Week.

Fredericton, June 15.—Among persons from outside this province who will speak at the tenth annual convention of the New Brunswick Women's Institute to this city on the 20th, 21st and 22nd, are Miss Helen MacDougall, superintendent of Women's Institutes of Prince Edward Island; Miss Annie Stuart of Grand Pre, convener of national events; Fredericton Women's Institutes of Canada; and Miss Eleanor Ross, superintendent of Women's Institutes of Quebec.

The sessions are to be held in the gymnasium of the Normal School, morning, afternoon and night. A new feature is to be community singing, with Mrs. F. A. Good, of this city, in charge. This will take place at each session. It is estimated that about 100 delegates from the various institutes in the province will attend.

The convention will open at 9.30 a. m. on June 20, C. J. Osman of Hillsboro, president of the advisory board, presiding. His Worship Mayor Reid will deliver an address of welcome, Mrs. Lee Kearney of Bath will reply. The provincial superintendent, Miss Elizabeth Nutter, of Fredericton, then will present her report. Routine business will follow.

Miss MacDougall of Nova Scotia will deliver her address next, and reports from institutes will follow. Tuesday evening will be devoted to social entertainment.

Wednesday morning controls of fires will be the subject of a representative of the New Brunswick forest division in an address. Provincial convener of standing committees will present reports and other business will be done. Miss Carruthers of P. E. I. will report on Wednesday afternoon. Mrs. Herbert Read of St. John's will speak on "Institute Officials and Their Duties." Miss Harriet Maklejohn, director of the public health nursing service, will deliver an address.

A consultation meeting for mothers will be introduced by a brief address by Mrs. Myles Fowler of Hampton, who will take as her subject "Good Manners in Children." Mrs. Marshall Armstrong of Perth will follow with a five minute talk on "Home Training for Children." Discussion will follow.

Premier Foster will address the convention on Wednesday morning. The minister of agriculture, Hon. D. M. McCreary, will follow him. Miss Stuart also will speak on Wednesday morning. "The Dairy and Good Citizenship" will be the subject of Miss Helen G. Campbell of Ottawa.

Thursday morning committees will report and new business will be transacted. Unfinished business will occupy Thursday afternoon. The final session will take place on Thursday night, when Miss Ross of Quebec will speak and also Miss Alberta Burns, Victorian Order nurse, of Moncton, and Miss G. Helen Morant of St. Andrews, whose subject will be "Citizenship Craft," with which she is personally connected.



RECENT DEATHS

Ott E. Hoyt.

The death of Ott E. Hoyt occurred yesterday at his residence, 93 Duke street, West End, at the advanced age of eighty-one years. Mr. Hoyt was born at Hoyt Station, Sanbury county, and was the son of the late John and Ruth Hoyt. He lived nearly all his life at Hoyt Station, having removed to this city only about eighteen years ago. He was a carpenter by trade and was a member of the Baptist church at Hoyt Station. He was a man of sterling character and was highly respected by all who knew him. He is survived by his wife, one son, William E. of this city; also two sisters, Mrs. George Dewitt and Mrs. Luke E. Dewitt, both of Lunenburg county. The funeral will be held this evening from his late residence at 8 o'clock and the interment will take place tomorrow morning at Hoyt Station after the arrival of the train from this city.
