FRICK ART VALUES SHRINK \$17,000,000

Collection Originally Estimated at \$30,000,000 Appraised in 1919 at \$13,000,000—May be Worth More Now.

(New York Times.) The value of Henry C. Frick's art collection, originally estimated at \$30,000,000, has declined to about \$13,000,000. This shrinkage, paralleling that of his securities, already made public, was disclosed yesterday when an appraisal was filed in the surrogate's office with other papers accompanying the application of the State Controller to determine whether Mr. Frick's art collection and the Fifth Avenue place which houses it are to go to New York city when Mrs. Frick dies or to be sold to pay the taxes on the estate. Among the more striking examples of depreciation are the famous Velasquez portrait of Philip IV. of Spain, for which Frick was said to have paid \$400,000 in 1911, appraised at \$80,000, and Gainsborough's portrait of Anne Duncannon, at one time said to have been sold for \$400,000, appraised at \$175,000.

The shrinkage in Mr. Frick's securities was disclosed several months ago when when it transpired that \$30,000,000 he had left to charitable, religious and educational institutions had dwindled to \$20,000,000. While an actual decline in market value of many of his holdings was responsible in large part for this depreciation in the shares of the residuary legatees, the fact that large sums in taxes also came out of the residuary estate contributed to the decline.

The most valuable group in collection regarded as one of the finest private assemblages of art objects in the whole world is the Fragonard panels, which Mr. Frick acquired, with many other rare pieces, including costly engravings, when the J. P. Morgan collection was dispersed. They are appraised at \$750,000. The Gilbert Stuart bust portrait of George Washington, bought by Mr. Frick when it was imported from England in 1919, and then said to have been held by dealers at \$750,000, is appraised at \$40,000.

While the precise total value fixed by the appraisers—\$13,210,295—is not binding upon the New York appraisers, it is probable their expert valuation will be accepted without question. Most of the collection is on the first floor of the Frick mansion, where paintings valued at \$7,070,000 are hung. The rugs, furnishings and hangings on this floor are inventoried at \$1,274,433, and other items are: Assorted art objects, \$613,700; bronzes, \$1,202,775; porcelains, \$926,500, and Limoges enamels, \$884,550. The paintings on the second floor are worth \$724,350, and the furnishings, \$105,588.
