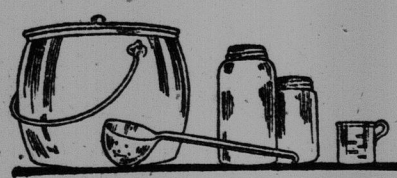

SUCCESS OF RED CROSS SOCIETY CAMPAIGN

The regular monthly meeting of the New Brunswick division of the Canadian Red Cross Society was held here yesterday afternoon with R. T. Hayes, M.P.P., in the chair and a good attendance of members present. The secretary, Miss Ethel Jarvis, submitted her report, which was, in part, as follows:
During the last month the campaign work has still been going on and we are just now beginning to get results. In some parts of the province the results have surpassed our expectations. Our province can now boast of at least ten new life members and the return of still coming in. A very great deal of permanent organizing work has been done in connection with the campaign whose results are very satisfactory to the society. The enrollment is now being prepared under county classification. The most important event of the month was the preparation and sending out of our public health graduate nurses.

Each nurse has gone to the field with a complete kit prepared at the depot by the ladies of the sewing committee, under Miss Allison; the surgical committee, under Miss Ruddock and Mrs. Frederick Harding; and the ladies of the Catholic circles, under Mrs. O'Brien and Mrs. M. Marr. These kits contain surgical and medical supplies and also emergency supplies that will be needed. The districts are receiving the nurses cordially and warmly, and Riley Brook and St. Martins have reorganized in order that their societies may assist the nurses.

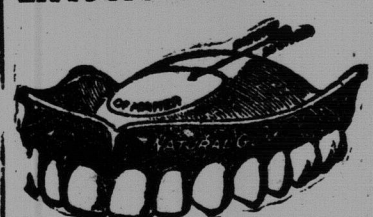
