Washington, Aug. 22.—Statistics gathered by Major Gestford, superintendent of the Washington police, show that oil and water and hair tonics are growing in popularity here as beverages. Out of 1,224 arrests for intoxication during the six months ended June 30, the following beverages caused the greatest number: Whiskey, 548; alcohol, 224; flavoring extracts, 142; hair tonic, 109; bay rum, 108, and toilet water, 28.
