Name Her Best Girl Swimmer in The United States

New York, Dec. 4.—Miss Ethel Bledtrey of the New York World's S. A., a schoolgirl of seventeen, has been declared America's greatest girl swimmer of 1919 by a vote of the prominent coaches in the country.

The distinction was claimed locally for one of two other mermaids, so there was sought the opinion of able instructors in seventeen cities where water sports for women are most popular. Thirteen responded and eleven named Miss Bledtrey. The two others, in San Francisco and Los Angeles, selected their own California champion, Mrs. Frances Schroth of San Francisco.

It is worthy of note that in nearly all cases Miss Charlotte Boyle, a teammate of Miss Bledtrey's, was mentioned as a dangerous close rival for leadership to the latter, whose sensational performances at the back stroke were the one mark of superiority over Miss Boyle in free style swimming there was virtually no choice between them.

The views of the selecting judges are reflected collectively in the following letter from Matt Mann, the former Brooklyn expert, now attached to both the Detroit A. C. and Duluth B. C.:

"Miss Bledtrey's performances stamp her the best this country ever had. I think she is the best girl swimmer that ever lived. With special training there is no doubt she can break any existing record at either free style or back-stroke swimming. The ability she has shown to step to the mark at any time and complete successfully in any event show that she is absolutely the peer.

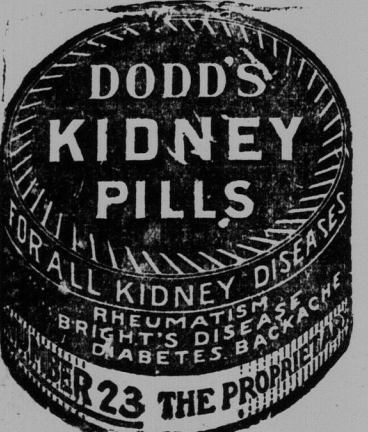
"I think very highly of the skill of Miss Charlotte Boyle, and I believe Miss Bledtrey's sensational success is due in large measure to her, but she has done nothing at the back stroke so far, and this must be counted against her. I place her a very close second."

Miss Bledtrey scored more points than any fair contestant in the National swimming championships of this year. She ran up a total of twenty-one. Miss Boyle leads on the official list, with twenty-two points, but only seventeen were garnered in actual swimming; the other five stand for a victory in the plunge for distance.

Miss Bledtrey's best performances at free style swimming include fifty yards in 0:29.4-3; 100 yards in 1:09.9-3; 200 yards in 2:24.4-3; 300 yards in 4:15; 400 yards in 6:18.4-1; and at the back stroke, fifty yards in 2:17.5-5. All these times are official, although technicalities prevented some of those representing records from being accepted.

California points to Mrs. Schroth's respective marks of 220 yards in 2:54.3-5; 300 yards in 7:19 and 10 yards back stroke in 1:27 to prove her leadership, but they fail to call attention to conditions. These three accepted records were made in a twenty-one yard pool, with absolutely smooth water and numerous waves, two material advantages, while Miss Bledtrey's corresponding feats were accomplished in open water, 110-yard courses.

EUROPE'S FINANCIAL MEASURES

Plans for Government Finance in France and Italy.

New York, Dec. 1.—Travellers returning from abroad, and dispatches printed in the American newspapers, have this week described an extremely gloomy state of affairs in Europe. Some light on how the Europeans view their own position is afforded by statements like that of M. Raphael Georges Levy before the General Council of the Parliamentary Conference on Trade, who is quoted in the London Bankers' Magazine as estimating "the total financial damage suffered by France during the five years of war at £14,130,000,000, this figure including £3,420,000,000 for material damage done to property, and £5,720,000,000 for the actual war costs. Eventually, M. Levy stated, part of this amount would be made good by the payments due from Germany under the Peace Treaty, but in the meantime France would naturally have recourse to borrowing and to taxation, the next budget being expected to amount to at least £1,000,000,000.

"As a first stage towards meeting the situation outlined by M. Levy, arrangements are being made in France for the issue of a new loan, which is expected to take the form of a lottery bond issue, and by this means it is hoped to raise a capital sum of approximately £2,000,000,000.

"In Italy even stronger measures have been under consideration, and the early issue was at one time foreshadowed of a forced loan which, in effect, was to follow the principle of the capital levy. It was reported that possessions valued up to £260 would be exempted, but from that figure up to £2,000 the levy would be at the rate of 5 per cent, rising gradually to 40 per cent. In the case of fortunes of £2,000,000 and upward."
