St. John's, Nfld., Sept. 22—Governor Davidson has assumed the lieutenant-governorship of the first Newfoundland regiment which goes to England next month, where it will be organized with the 1st Newfoundland Regiment of the Imperial authorities. Only company officers are appointed here.

Gagetown, Sept. 21—Feeling that they must keep in step with the fine patriotic work done by the women in other towns of New Brunswick, the ladies of the Women's Institute who have been interested in working for the war sufferers met at the home of the president of the institute, Mrs. H. B. Bridges, on Saturday evening and formed themselves into a branch of the Red Cross Society. The officers elected were: President, Mrs. W. S. Wilkins; secretary-treasurer, Miss Pearl Peters. A committee of management consisting of Mrs. T. D. Sharp, Miss Frances Casswell, Miss Molly Otty and others was appointed. Work will be rushed along as rapidly as possible. On Saturday evening next the society will hold a pie social and dance in the hall for the purpose of increasing the funds for buying materials. A record attendance of patriotic citizens from outlying towns is expected.

MUSICAL TREAT TO HEAR CHRISTIAN KRIENS

Great Violinist Heard With Great Delight in Centenary Hall—Mrs. Newman's Vocal Work Also Greatly Appreciated.

The concert last night in the Centenary church conducted under the auspices of the Free Kindergarten Association was the musical event of the season. The affair was largely attended and the rare talent of the artists—Christian Kriens, violinist and composer, and Helen Wetmore Neuman, the possessor of an exceptionally rich soprano voice—were appreciated beyond expression. Mr. Kriens rendered many of his own compositions which were written by him during his sojourn at Brown's Plains this summer, and the enthusiasm of the audience evidenced the admiration of his work. Miss Neuman sang one of his most recent vocal compositions, I Love Thee, with splendid effect and so well was the artist pleased with her rendition that he immediately dedicated it to her. She received the manuscript of the piece only yesterday afternoon.

The programme was a luscious treat for music lovers. It was an exhibition of ability such as local people have seldom enjoyed. Mrs. S. Kent Scovill accompanied Mr. Kriens on the piano and did honor to the reputation of the city as a musician. Mrs. J. M. Barnes accompanied the singer and she also did full justice to the occasion.

Probably the most successful selection of the evening was Mr. Kriens' vocal composition, I Love Thee, sung by Mrs. Neuman. The audience was enraptured with the sweetness of it and especially so on account of the brilliant soprano interpretation of it. Among the other selections by Miss Neuman were: Ah, Forse! I'll Travel; by Venetian; Know a Hill; by Whelpley; Winter Buttery; by Foster; Yesterday and Today; by Spross and Prima Vera Waltz, by Strauss.

Local people who are capable of passing a criticism on violin playing adjudged Mr. Kriens a master. His rendition of Chopin pieces and his own compositions was considered marvellous. The mellow sweetness of the notes from his master hand were entrancing and the audience carried into ecstasies of delight.

The expression in the notes was wonderful. Dutch Lullaby, composed by himself, created a great impression. In fact all of his own pieces, Beethoven's Minuet in G was also played among his selections and bowed with a master's touch.

The piano selections by Mrs. S. Kent Scovill were well rendered. Of course Mrs. Scovill was well known as a musician here and her playing has always greatly pleased.

The profits accrued from the concert are to be devoted to the kindergarten work.
