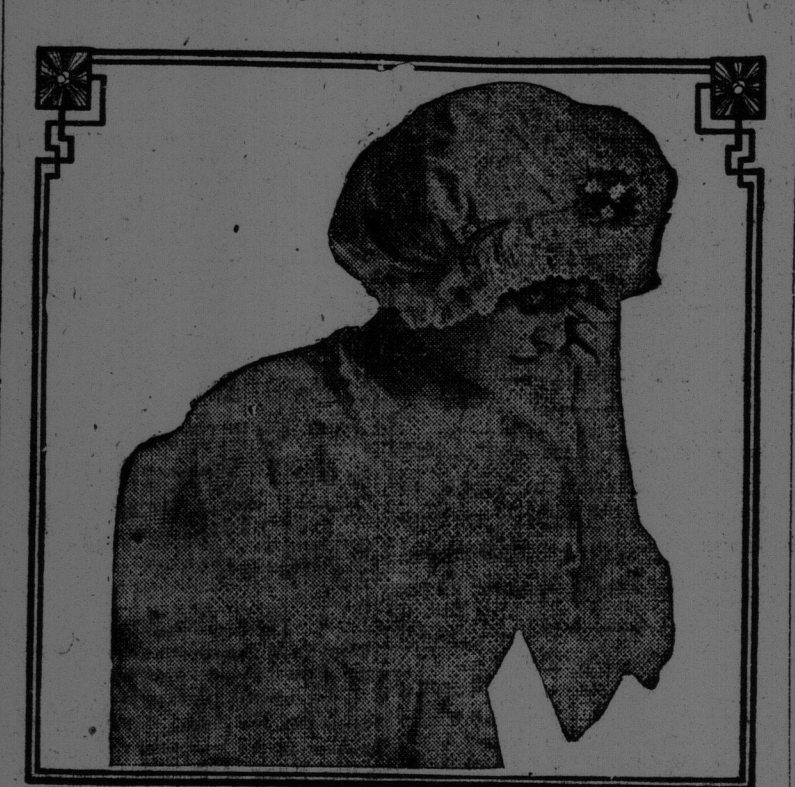
## Little Beauty Chats

## The Arms Become Rounded If Properly Exercised

Do not become discouraged if your arms are a wee bit too thin or too fat, as I can tell you a way to make them symmetrical and divinely pretty.

Instead of massaging your frail arms with this oil and that, fair lady, and waiting months for inadequate results, do as other girls are doing and exercise your arms. I don't mean the exercise one gets by playing the piano or washing the dishes.



Well-known physical culture school told me would develop attenuated arms, as follows: Lie on your back on the floor and throw your arms out to the right and left, on a line with your shoulders, and open and close the fists from fifteen to twenty times, separating the fingers widely each time the hand is opened. Go through this exercise for five moments, being careful to turn the backs of the hands down when the fists are closed and the palms of the hands down when the hands are opened.

Quite different is the next exercise, as it requires you to stand erect with chest thrown up and out and abdomen drawn in. If my close in beauty has now assumed this position, take a long step to the front, bending over until fingertips touch the floor. Inhale deeply, then clench fists and draw arms up and back as if they were lifting the weight of the body to the rear foot. When once more in original position, relax and exhale. Repeat movement twenty times.

Although anything that brings the muscles of the arms into play is not to be sneezed at. No, I am referring to some physical culture exercises in which I have great faith.

If you can spare the time for these arm exercises before breakfast, do so, but if this time of day finds you with every minute taken up by household duties, postpone your beauty work until later in the morning, say, an hour before lunch, as it will be the means of giving you a most excellent appetite.

## R. H. DOCKRILL, PRESIDENT OF OPERA HOUSE COMPANY; FIRST DIVIDEND DECLARED

The annual meeting of the St. John Opera House Company, Limited, took place last evening when for the first time in the history of the house the shareholders voted on the shares of stock held instead of each shareholder having one vote as has been the custom formerly. A dividend of six per cent, with four per cent bonus was declared. This is the first time that a dividend has been declared and the Opera House can now be considered as one of the paying businesses of the city.

The dividend is payable on all stock registered by February 1. A committee will revise the by-laws.

R. H. Dockrill had 3,400 votes and the new ticket for officers and directors was presented to the meeting on a printed ballot. This included only a few of the old directors. A. O. Skinner, who was formerly president of the company and was identified with the organization, was not present at the meeting.

The result of the election was as follows: R. H. Dockrill, president; S. P. Gerow, first vice-president; John Mitchell, second vice-president; T. A. Linton, David Connell, John Ross, H. J. Anderson, E. W. Paul, T. L. Reed and P. J. Mooney, directors.

At a meeting of the directors and officers, E. W. Paul, R. H. Dockrill and S. P. Gerow were selected as a board of management. H. J. Anderson was elected secretary and John Ross treasurer. Mr. Anderson was formerly manager.

The meeting was presided over by S.

## Daily Hints For the Cook

NUT CAKE.  
One cup of butter, 2 of sugar, 1 of sweet milk, 5 eggs, 1 pound flour, 1 pound of raisins or currants, 1 pint of hickory nuts, 1-1/2 teaspoons of baking powder.

SQUASH PIE.  
One and a half cups stewed and sifted squash, 1 cup sugar, pinch of cinnamon, and ginger, 1-2 teaspoon salt, 1 egg beaten and one cup boiling milk. Bake one hour in one crust.

EVERTON CAKE.  
One and half cups granulated sugar, 3/4 cup butter, 6 egg whites, 1 cup sweet milk, 2 1/2 cups flour, 2 teaspoons baking powder. Flavor with lemon. Two-thirds of this mixture is to be baked as two layers of jelly cake. The remainder to be baked in same shape after adding two table-spoons molasses, 1 1/2 cups raisins, 3 chopped figs, 1 teaspoon cinnamon, 1/2 each allspice and nutmeg, and 2 table-spoons flour. Put the dark layer in centre and put together with a white frosting.

## SHOWS LARGE INCREASE

During 1912 the general increase in the amount of business transacted in St. John was reflected in the larger volume of business through the local post office. There was an increase of 63 per cent. in second class matter mailed; 49 per cent in savings bank deposits; 45 per cent in postal notes sold; 26 per cent in money orders issued; 18 per cent in postal notes paid; 12 per cent in postage stamps sold; 8 per cent in deliveries at St. John and 6 per cent in matter passing through St. John.
