


HAZEN GOVERNMENT OVERRIDES AUDIT ACT

Protests of Auditor Loudon Were Useless And Over-Expenditure Went on-Here Are Some of The Plums Handed Out

Fredericton, N. B., March 9—The report of the auditor-general, which was brought down this afternoon, is remarkable for the number of orders from the treasury board, their being no less than forty-one authorizing over-expenditure of more than \$100,000 over and above the estimated expenditure.
