Interstate Commerce Commission in U.S. Orders an Investigation.

Washington, July 11.—Acting upon a recommendation of the coal committee, the Interstate Commerce Commission ordered a general investigation of the transportation of anthracite in the U. S. and into foreign countries.

A paragraph of the recent coal commission report declared that rates on anthracite apparently constituted a very large proportion of the consumers' cost of the commodity. The level of such rates was said to be possibly too high to be justifiable, and the Interstate Commerce Commission was asked to look into the subject.

The commission yesterday served notice on all common carriers that it would seek evidence on the subject, taking up rates on cargo and bunker would seek evidence on the subject, taking up rates on cargo and bunker coal at ocean ports, and rates on boat lines over the Great Lakes. Times and places for hearings will be fixed later.
