12th. Voted, That Correspondence be continued with Sister Associations in the State of Maine and Nova-Scotia.

3th. Appointed Elder Miles, Messenger to Sister Associations in the State of Maine, and that the sum of £10 be given him to defray his expences.—In case of failure, it is voted, that he appoint a substitute.

14th. Appointed Elder J. CRANDALL, Messenger to Sister Association in Nova-Scotia, and that £4 5s. be given him to defray big expences. In case of failure, to appoint a substitute.

15th. Voted, That the Association be held at Sackville, the third Monday after 20th June, 1831.

16th. Voted, That Elder F. W. Miles preach the Introductory Sermon. In case of failure, Elder J. MARSTERS.

17th. Voted, That Elder J. MARSTERS write the Circular, and Flder W. SEARS, the Corresponding Letter.

18th. That this Association gratefully acknowledge the exertions of the Female Mite Societies throughout the Province.

19th. Voted, that Brother Miles superintend the printing of the Minutes—and that the number of copies to be printed be left to his discretion.

20th. Voted, That a day of Fasting and Prayer be recommended to be observed on the 1st day of January, 1831; as also the Monthly Missionary Prayer Meetings.

21st. Voted, That as we highly approve of the Baptist Missionary Magazine of Nova-Scotia and New-Brunswick, we strongly recommend to all the members of our churches, not only to take it themselves, but also to use their influence to promote its circulation.—We also request that they will communicate to Elder C. Tupper, of Amherst, (N. S.) or Elder F. W. Miles, of St. John, (N. B.) brief statements relative to the gathering, formation, progress, and present state of the Baptist Churches in this Province; in order that an historical account of them may be inserted in the Magazine.
