PAROCHIAL STATISTICS.

EXTRACTS FROM THE REPORTS OF INCUMBENTS,

1871.

1. Albion and Mono.—A Brick Church is now in course of erection at Sand Hill; \$1000 has been contributed for the purpose. Two "Mason & Hamlin" organs, and two Sunday School Libraries have also been purchased. There is great need that the Mission should be divided, or an assistant minister appointed. The Glebe could now be made to yield \$200, and the people could give \$300.

7. Berkeley and Chester.—I was led to take charge of the Mission by a representation that I was to receive \$150 per annum; but, in consequence of the non-payment thereof, and the additional expense of horse-hire, I shall be compelled to resign the charge of Berkeley. In Chester I think the church is prospering, but suffers from want of a resident clergyman. I should also add that, whilst the Cathedral of St. James takes large rents from lands in Chester and Norway, the people complain that the church is not supported in part from revenues derived from such lands.

8. Beverley.—One church erected during the year, St. Alban's, Rockton, which is free, the sum of \$1475 having been contributed for that purpose. There remains a debt of about \$100. The Mission would benefit much by being divided; and if Strabane and another convenient station were set off together, Copetown and Sheffield might be worked more advantageously by having service on each Sunday, instead of once a fortnight as at present.

9. Bobcaydeon.—A free church has been erected during the year, and \$1000 contributed; also a parsonage built. The Mission is too large, but will not at present bear dividing.

11. Brighton.—A bell for the church has been purchased.

12. Brock.—Two free churches built; about \$3000 contributed. There are many places in this Mission where good congregations could be gathered together; for instance at Pefferlaw, Vroomanton, Sunderland, Derryville, Manilla, Woodville, and Oakwood.

14. CALEDONIA.—A division of the Mission is required; in fact there is enough work for three clergymen, though no means of support at present.

21. Collingwood.—One free Church in course of erection. Increased church accommodation is required in Collingwood. A second missionary could be advantageously employed, but I should have to pay him myself.

22. Cookstown.—A division of the Mission is required. Plenty of work for another clergyman; but no present means of supporting one.

23. CREDIT. — One church erected; \$2600 contributed. An assistant much required, but support infinitesimal.

24. CREEMORE AND STAYNER.—One free church has been erected at Stayner; \$2400 contributed. A division of the Mission is required; but at present only a Lay Reader can be employed.
