Q.12. "With regard to this window, was it broken when you arrived?"

A.12. "Yes."

Q.13. "When had you last seen it in an unbroken condition?"

A.13. "About 1 c'clock.

The Defending Officer now cross-examines the Witness.

Q. 1. "You arrived at this window and saw the accused, Sapper Fell, at the table with a tin in each hand. Is it not possible that he was resting on this table and the tins were in his hands on the table? He could have had his hands on the tins while looking for further tins?"

A. 1. "I do not know."

Q. 2. "He had his hands on the tins on the table?"

A. 2. "Yes."

Q. 3. "The window you say was not broken before, was it intact?"

A. 3. "Yes."

The Court questions the Witness.

Q. 1. "Was the window large enough for a man to climb through?"

A. 1. "Yes."
