Any person who is the sole head of a family, or any male over 18 years old, may homestead a quarter section (186 acres, more or less) of available Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. The applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Lands Agency of Sub-Agency for the district. Entry by proxy may be made at any agency, on teriain conditions, by father, mother, son, taughter, brother or sister of intending homesteader.
