WOULDN'T WIN ON A QUIBBLE

Foster's Suit Invalidated by Technical Error. Foster's suit against the Union Trust Company was invalidated by a technical error.

But Editor McDonald—Investigation the Advantage—Refused to Take Renewal. The investigation into the Foster case was refused to be renewed.

TORONTO, Feb. 15.—Justice Magee this morning in the slender and libel suit of Hon. Geo. E. Foster against the Union Trust Company...

The feature of the session was the many objections raised by Foster's counsel to the admission of documents and occasionally to questions asked by Mr. Rowell. They were noted by the judge.

Col. Elliot M. Stevenson, Supreme High Chief Ranger of the Independent Order of Foresters, was the first witness called. He was asked to identify letters from Mr. Foster, minutes of the Union Trust Company and many other documents which have already figured in the insurance inquiry and in statements of claims and defense in the present suit.

So the position was that \$2,000,000 worth of stock, \$1,980,000 of which was owned by the Foresters and \$200,000 by the Foster family, was to be returned to the Foresters.

At 10:15, the Union Trust, Saturday afternoon, closed its doors. The company's assets, including real estate, were valued at \$1,500,000.
