

The two salt water sections of the Panama Canal are now open for actual use. These two sections of the canal connect respectively the Atlantic and Patric oceans. In this view the spectator has his back to the Atlantic Ocean and is facing the Gatun locks. The tug shown in the foreground has come up a wide channel between low wooded hills. The waterway at this section has the appearance of a natural estuary. It ends at the lock show n here. It is at this point that the vessel encounters the fresh water which operates the two sets of locks. In order that the Atlantie and Patric to class of every vessel millions of gallons of water will of necessity pass out of the canal.




