CARLING, Hon. JOHN, P.C. (London.)

Youngest s. of Thomas Carling, Esq., of London, Ont., a native of Yorkshire, England, who came to Canada in 1818, and settled in Middlesex, Ont., 1819. B. in the Township of London, Middlesex, 23 Jan. 1828. M. Hannah, eldest dau. of the late Henry Dalton, Esq., of London, Ont. A mem. of the firm of Carling & Co., brewers, London. Was a dir. of the Great Western Railway for a number of years, and also a dir. of the London, Huron & Bruce and London and Port Stanley Railways. Elected a Water Commr. for London in 1878; and subsequently appointed Chairman of the Board. Was returned as a mem. for London to the Can. Assem., 18 Dec. 1857, and held the seat continuously from that time until Confederation, when he was re-elected in Aug. 1867 for the Commons, and held the seat up to the g.e. 1874; was also returned to the Local House in 1867, holding the portfolio of Minister of Agriculture and Public Works in the Sandfield Macdonald Govt. from July 1867 until Dec. 1871, when the Govt. was defeated and retired from office. Was Receiver-General in the old Govt. of Can. in 1862. Sworn of the Privy Council and apptd. Postmaster General, 23 May 1882. Re-elected to Commons at g.e. 1878, and again at last g.e. A Liberal Conservative. - London, Ont.; Rideau Club.

CARON, Hon. Joseph Phillippe Rene Adolphe, B. C. L., Q. C. P. C. (Quebec County.)

Eld. surviving s. of the late Hon. R. E. Carón, Lieut. Governor of the Prov. of Quebec. B. in the City of Quebec, 1843. Ed. at the Seminary of Quebec, at Laval Univ. and at McGill Univ., at which latter institution he graduated B.C.L., 1865. M., 25 June 1867, Alice, only dau. of the late Hon.
