DICKIE, Hon. JOHN B.

Of Scotch-Irish parentage. First returned to Parlt. for Guysboro', March 1874, on resignation of sitting mem. Re-elected at g. c. 1874. Called to L.C. 1878. A Reformer.—Gugsborough, N.S.

Fraser, Hon. James, J.P.

Descended paternally from the Frasers of Farraline or Foyers, and maternally from those of Gortblie, two of the oldest and most respectable families in the north of Scotland. B. in Boleskine, Inverness-shire, Scot., 7 March 1802. Came to N.S. 1804, where, and in N.B. he was educated. M. 1826, Elizabeth, eld. dau, of Rev. Peter Gordon, of New Glasgow, N.S. Has held a commission in the militia of N.B. and N.S. Elected Chief of the "New Clan Fraser" of B.N.A. 1869. Called to L.C. 1867. A Conservative.—Drummond Cottage, New Glasgow.
