"There shall be at least three regular meetings of Council during each month of the academic term, excepting the months of September and December when there shall be at least one. For the purpose of By-Law April shall not be considered part of the academic year," (By Law V(i)).

'A quorum of the Council shall consist of 50 percent plus one of the voting membership of the Council," (By-Law V(2)). This by-law is very important because meetings have been cut short because the SRC often loses quorum because members leave early.

"Meetings of the Council and the Union shall be called by the President (a) when he deems it

necessary, or (b) when he is requested to do so by 25 per cent of the voting members of Council, or (c) upon presentation of a petition to the President signed by at least 10 per cent of the membership of the Union," (By-Law V(3)). Because of the criticism of last week's meeting, part 3(b) has been refined. The 25 percent of the representatives will have to sign a petition stating their

There is also a provision on the constitution concerning emergency meetings. Emergency meetings can be called either by the President or SRC executive. Only the matter that caused the emergency can be discussed. The second difference bet-

One final point should be made about these meeting. Bylaw V(9) states that "Except as inconsistent with these By-Laws or the Regulations, Robert's Rules of Order shall be applied." Robert's Rules is a book of procedures for running a meeting. This book causes many delays at SRC meetings. In an effort to follow the rules to the letter the SRC spend a considerable amount of time discussing procedural matters.

Debaters place 8th in Victoria

National Debating championships in Victoria, B.C. John Besnitch and John Jerney were the two members of the society to attend the tournament. The topic of debate was human rights. These two people did very well at the tournament. The UNB team placed eighth out of 34 teams. This is an improvement for the UNB Debating Society, since last year at the same tournament, UNB placed sixteenth. Bosnitch remarked that the improvement was made because the UNB team was the most dedicated and fanatical team. No individual rankings were received by the contestants. The level of debating from the other universities was unchanged from last year.

As usual in a debating tournament, there were some controversies. It cost \$1200 for the two members to attend the tournament. They hope to get a refund for their expenditures from the SRC, President Downey's office and the Alumni. At the October 29 Administrative Board meeting they received some support. The A.B. passed a motion to recommend to the SRC that the UNB Debating Society be

allocated \$500. The Debating Society has made large gains in its short life. Two years ago there was no Debating Society at UNB. Last year when it became operational, it had a fair amount of success; debates in the Blue Lounge of the SUB made the society visible on campus. Interest in debating at that time made the number of participants in the society swell to between 25-30 members. These debates in the Blue Lounge will be continued this year. The first of these debates will be held today and the topic will be the Third Century Fund.
