CHSR's Panorama is Based Upon Frequency of Air Play

Campus/Community radio station CHSR FM recognized the efforts of over 100 volunteers this past weekend at the 34th Anniversary Social. The highlight of the evening was the 25th annual presentation of the "Barry Awards".

Long time volunteer David Pirie was recognized for his five years of volunteer service as he was awarded the prestigious "Directors Award". Mr. Pirie (who hosts Celtic Connections, Sun 2-4pm) has been integral in many initiatives, including the development of the very successful "Highland Radio" in association with the New Brunswick High-

land Games each August.

"Highland Radio" was also the recipient of a Barry Award. For the second year in a row Mr. Pirie accepted an award for "Best Special Event Program." Highland Radio is three days of live programming direct from the New Brunswick Highland Games site at the Old Government House on Woodstock Road. Programming is totally devoted to celtic and gaelic music and other things related to the games and the culture.

Among the other "Barry" recipients were "African Hour" with host David Hobona (Sun, 6-7pm) for Best Cultural Program, "Lunchbox Conversations" (Wed, noon) with hosts Allan Wong, Dan Ennis and Tristis Bhaired picked up the award for Spoken Word Program, John Hansen and his "Way

Back Machine" (Tues, 10am-noon) took top honors in the Open Format Music Category and Shantell Powell took home an award for Special Interest Music Programming for "Erotic Tablesaw" (Thurs, 12-2am).

Other Barry recipients included Gene Senior for News & Sports, Mary Kathryn Whitney for Behind the Scenes and Tonya Price and Archie Nadon sharing the award for Rookie of the Year.

The "Barry's" are named for Dr. Barry Yoell, the founder and first Director of Radio UNB in 1960-61. It was under Dr. Yoell's (then an undergraduate student) leadership that campus radio was established at UNB. Dr. Yoell, now a medical doctor who lives in Wolfville, NS, continues to be active in the development of campus/community radio at UNB.
