LAKEVIEW — Within the space of a minute, a man slipped, fell 11 feet to the water and drowned Sunday evening at the Lakeview generating station.

Patrick James Doherty,

23, was working on a construction crew placing pilings for a new pier. He was giving hand instructions to the crane operator when he backed off the edge of the pier and fell through a

maze of scaffolding to the water.

The foreman, who had his back to Doherty when he fell, said, "I heard his hard-hat hit something, but he had disappeared by the

time I clambered down to water level."

Doherty had been living with relatives in Toronto after coming from Dartmouth, Nova Scotia, to work on the construction job.
