Heciless to eas, it was an exceptional pleasure to me to give them full accounts of the great kindness which I received while in Japan.

Since I last wrote you, I have been taken into the Cabinet, and as now in charge of the Department of which I was formerly the Deputy Head. The change means an increase of work and responsibility, but naturally the opportunity is larger, and the change is very velcome. I think I shall enjoy public life very much.
