

Why conscripted men in Europe must be allowed gratuities.

The Government has already recognized that the men who went to Kiska are entitled to gratuities. It is obviously out of the question to deny the gratuities to the men who are sent to greater danger in Europe.

But like the Kiska men, under General McNaughton's proposal, they will count only their service outside Canada. If any of them return to Canada and continue to serve, they cannot count the time in Canada, so general service men will always preserve some advantage. This approximates as closely to equal justice as it is practicable to reach.
