Spatement by the Prime Minister of Canada regarding approval of Treaties of Peace with Italy, Roumania, Hungary and Pinhaud.

Honourable members will recall that a Conference for the conclusion of peace treaties with Italy, Bulgaria, Hungary, Roumania and Finland was held in Paris from July 29 to Sctober 15, 1946. As Prime Minister and Secretary of State for External Affairs I had the honour of representing Ganada as Chairman of the delegation. The other delegate was my colleague the Minister of National Defence; and as I was unable to remain throughout the entire Conference, Mr. Claxton became Chairman of the Ganadian delegation on my departure from Paris.
