He grabbed hold of Gnr McKinnon and they both went down to the pavement, the Sgt Holding him down and then the civilian police entered. Cross examined by the Defence. Gnr Brohpy, when you came out of the Hotel, you saw Sgt Feather-Q-43. stone on the side walk ? Sgt Featherstone was being picked up. Onr McKinnon Yes, sir, Sgt Feath was standing alone. A=43. How far was Gnr McKinnon from Sgt Featherstone at that time ? Q-44. I couldn't say exactly, about 5 feet, sir: Did Sgt Featherstone have hold of Gnr McKinnons arm when he A-44. Q-45. was lying on the sidewalk ? A-45. Q-46. No. sir. Did you see Sgt Featherstone take a drink ? I never saw him take a drink that night. A-46. Court interrupts: President to Accused: Do you recognize the accused ? Yes. sir. Do you recall seeing him in the Hotel on the night of 30 Oct? A-48. Yes, sir. Court: Q-49. Onr Brophy you said that when you came out you were 6 ft from Sgt Featherstone ? A-49. Yes, sir. Q-50. A-50. How close was the accused ? He was directly between. While Sgt Featherstone was lying on the ground you had a fairly clear view of him, you recongized Sgt Featherstone on the ground, which was was he lying, left or right to the door or what way? A little to the left of the door as you came out. Q-51. A-51. C-9732 Gnr Allan, G.W. having been duly sworn is examined by the Prosecutor. 3rd Witness for the Prosecution. Do you recognize the accused ? Q-52. A-52. Q-53. A-53. Q-54. Yes, sir. What is his name ? Gnr McKinnon, sir. Have you ever been on any parties or any other sort of entertainments with him? A-54. When he came back where were you standing ? Q-61. A-61. I was standing next to the bar, about 2 paces from the accused. So you heard everything that went on between on McKinnon, Ferry,
