saying that I would like to teach in an Indian  
school and also explaining about my education.

I have complete highschool (Grade 12 certificate)  
and also 3 subjects of Senior Matriculation,  
namely: English, Chemistry and Mathematics  
according to the B.C. Standard of Education.

I understood that I could teach the  
Indian children with just a high school  
education without having any teacher's training.  
Please let me know if this is not so.

If I could get a position as a teacher, I  
prefer to teach the children in the lower grades  
such as one, two and three.
