very fine and to our astonishment remained untouched by the heavy frosts, though others that had received stable manure suffered very severely. I was very much pleased with the effects on oats and clover. Quite astonishing also is the dark green, full leaved appearance of the sugar beets, notwithstanding the great continuous drouth. With the fruit trees where I especially applied the new fertilizer, I have fully learned how extraordinarily it acts. I would therefore urgently recommend every farmer to adopt this new method.
