

ciation of the Natural History Society of New Brunswick," which shall elect its own officers, thus constituting a separate organization within the Society, for the purpose of more effectively furthering its objects, and extending its usefulness.

(2). The Ladies' Auxiliary Association shall furnish to the Council of the Society two weeks before each Annual meeting, a full report of its operations during the preceding year, including a statement showing all receipts and expenditures resulting from or incidental to the work of the Auxiliary Association on behalf of the Society.

ARTICLE XIV.

MEETINGS AND NOTIFICATIONS.

(1). The ordinary meetings of the Society shall be held on the first Tuesday in each month, excepting the months of July, August and September, at 8 p. m. The chair may be taken when five members are present, and the meeting shall be conducted in the order prescribed in the By-laws. Every member shall have the privilege of introducing two friends to be present at the meetings and gatherings of the Society.

(2). The Annual Meeting of the Society shall be held on the third Tuesday in October, at 8 o'clock p. m.

(3). All notifications required by this Constitution may be given by letter or post card addressed to the members respectively at St. John, N. B., or at such other address as such members may respectively designate in writing to the Recording Secretary.

ARTICLE XV.

AUDITORS.

The Society shall elect yearly at the Annual meeting two Auditors, and in default of such election, or should a vacancy occur, they shall be appointed by the Council.
