A Social Service Opportunity

HAVE touched only a few of the representative things I do, but they indicate the opportunities for large development. I have no machinery e cept my own private house, a rented one, which has been in reality a Community Centre for some time, the street cars to cover distances so far as they go, and my two feet to make up the deficit. I have no money but the equivalent of an ordinary salary, and as for time, there are only twenty-four hours a day even in Japan. This account has been disgracefully overdrawn, at times almost to bankruptcy.

Plans must be made for the future if the opportunities I have indicated are to be conserved for the regeneration of Japan. It can best be done by trans-
