Much remains of exploration and discovery to be accomplished; and it may be taken for granted that although the goals for centuries so dear to the hearts of Britain's bravest sons have at last been won by heroes of other nations, yet the best of British brain and nerve is still available, and will be cheerfully sacrificed, if need be, in the pursuit of further and fuller knowledge of those "ends of the earth" which have had in the past and will continue to have in time to come an irresistible attraction for the most courageous men of our race.
