HALIFAX STREETS.

In compiling the following list of Streets with the only available information respecting the origin of their names the publisher would claim the indulgence of patrons as the field is a new one, and the reliable information is at present only limited, much of it being dependant on tradition.

The first division of the city was made by Col. Morris, the then Surveyor General, into blocks and named after the captains of the Militia as Forman's Division, Galland's Division and so on.

Then the streets were laid off and named from some circumstance connected with its situation or name of some distinguished individual connected with the early settlement such as Water Street, being along the line of water. Hollis Street supposed to be an imitation of a street of that name in Boston. Cornwallis street after the first Governor and founder of the settlement.

It will be our object in future editions to endeavour to correct the list and render them as complete and correct as possible, and therefore corrections and additional information is respectfully solicited.

AGRICOLA STREET—This street is presumed to be named in honor of John Young, father of the Sir William Young, who published a series of letters on Agriculture in the Acadian Recorder, during the years 1822—3—4, over the signature "Agricola."

ALBERT STREET—In compliments to H. R. H. the late Prince Consort.

ALMON STREET—Presumed to be in honor of Hon M B Almon or some other members of the Almon family.

ARTZ LANE—The Artz Family owning property in the vicinity.

BAUER STREET—The Bauer Family owning the field through which the street runs, they also owned Bauer's wharf.

BARRINGTON STREET—General Barrington succeeded Governor Hopson in the command of the expedition to take Guadaloupe, W. I., 1759.

BEBFORD ROW—In honor of John Russell, 4th Duke of Bedford who was Secretary of State, at the time of the Settlement of Halifax.

BLOWERS—It compliment to Judge Blowers whose residence and property was in the immediate vicinity.

CAMPBELL ROAD—Sir Colon Campbell was the chief projector of this Road, which then lead to the Governor's farm so called.
