HOMESTEAD REGULATIONS

ANY even numbered section of Dominion Lands in Manitoba, Saskatchewan, and Alberta, excepting 8 and 28, not reserved, may be homesteaded by any person who is the sole head of afamily, or any male over 18 years of age, to the extent of one-quarter section of 189 acres, mere or less.

or less.

Application for entry must be made in person by the applicant at a Dominon lands Agency er Sub-agency for the district in which the land is situate. Entry by proxy may, however, be made at an Agency on certain conditions by the father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister of an intending homesteader.

The homesteader is required to erform the homestead duties under one of the following plans:—

(1) At least six months' residence upon and cultivation of the land in each year for three years.

(2) A homesteader may, if he so desires, perform the required residence duties by living on farming land owned solely by him, not less than eightly (89) acres in extent, in the vicinity of his extent, land ownership is land will not meet this requirement.

ment.

(3 If the father (or mother, if
the father is deceased) of a
homesteader has permanent residence on farming land owned
solely by him, not less than eighty
(80) acres in extent, in the vicinity
of the homestead, or upon a
homestead entered for by him
in the vicinity, such homesteader may perform his own
residence duties by living with the
father (or mother).

(4) The term "wicinity" in the two preceding paragraphs is de-fined as meaning not more than nine miles in a direct line, exclu-sive of the width of road allow-ances crossed in the measurement.

(5) A homesteader intending to perform his residence duties in accordance with the above while living with parents or on farming land owned by himself must noti-fy the Agent for the district of such intention.

Six months' notice in writing must be given to the Commissioner of Dominion Lands at Ottawa, of intention to apply fer tawa, of patent.
