fedition have of late been less active in their attempts to promote disaffection for the grievances usually affigned to excite a spirit of discontent do not in this country exist: Instead of suffering under the devastation and calamities of war, this happy Province has scarcely experienced an interruption of the bleffings of peace.

These are advantages of which you, Gentlemen, must be perfectly convinced, and I make no doubt that you will earnestly endeavour to dissuss a just sense of them among your fellow subjects, on your return to your respective Counties, and that such considerations will tend to encrease the gratitude and attachment which is due to our most Gracious Sovereign to whose paternal care we are indebted, under Providence, for the enjoyment of such inestimable benefits.

After which, the Honorable Speaker of the Legislative Council said-

Gentlemen of the Legislative Council, and Gentlemen of the House of Assembly,

IT is His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor's Will and Pleasure, that this Provincial Parliament be Prorogued until Priday the Fourth day of July next, to be then here held; and this Prouincial Parliament is accordingly prorogued until Friday the Fourth day of July next.
