The check in question was from Bigelow and represented the difference between the rate of interest which he had charged Smith, and the usual rate. Accompanying it was a letter stating that the writer's conscience had bothered him.

Ottawa, March 15.—An order-in-council was approved to-day allowing the law to take its course in the case of Oliver Provost, now in jail at Port Arthur for the murder of three Frenchmen who kept a piggery near Port Arthur. Provost is to be hanged on Friday next, the 17th inst.

Dr. Burgess, Montreal, and Dr. Phelan Toronto, who were appointed by the Minister of Justice to look into the mental condition of the prisoner, have reported that while he is subject to hallucinations he is responsible. Provost was taken from the insanity ward of Kingston Penitentiary and put on trial. It was in consequence of this, which was not submitted to the jury in the way of evidence, that an enquiry had been made into Provost's condition.




